#### **Christmas Appeals 2017**

#### • NEED Project and Lidlington Church

The Church works with the NEED project to deliver Christmas food parcels in Lidlington. This year we are looking at between 8 – 10 parcels for Lidlington. The NEED project provide all the dried goods and Lidlington Church provide the perishables.

Demand for food parcels is greater than ever. This year the NEED project will be delivering around 500 Christmas in addition to their normal referrals.

#### We would like to ask you to help us!

The Church are collecting the following dried goods items which we will put into the NEED parcels so they do not have to contribute all the items to us.

Any donated items that that are over and above our own needs we will donated to NEED.

What do we need? In addition to the usual dried and tinned food, we include Christmas items such as: Tinned Salmon, Tinned Ham, Mince Pies, Christmas Cakes

Food often in short supply includes: Coffee, sugar, tomatoes, tinned fruit, & vegetables, tinned puddings, fish although anything else is gratefully received.

Toys are distributed to families in such need that the children may not be getting anything at all. All toys need to be either new or in as new condition.

#### Christmas Relief In Bedford (CRIB)

This is for the Prebend Centre in Bedford, open 365 days a year supporting vulnerable and homeless adults. Homelessness is on the rise in Bedford, autumn 2016 Bedford was in England's top ten highest local authority areas for rough sleeping.

Monetary donations will support new training and living skills programmes and dedicated support.

We will be taking a collection at the Carols by Candlelight service 6pm Christmas Eve and the Midnight Communion. Also unwrapped gifts of hats, scarves, socks, boxers, toiletries and chocolates would be most welcome.
